Fall Street Sweeping

The District will be conducting its fall street sweeping during the week of November 4th. Please do not park vehicles or trailers in the street or partially on the street/gutter section. Please do not push any needles or leaves into the street. In fact, if you want to help the district pay less for this service – please clean the street gutter in front of your house.

STREET SWEEPING – NOVEMBER 4-8:

Please move anything you may have at the bottom of your driveway to bridge your driveway and the street such as mud, dirt, needles, rubber, wood, or other material or products during these days. These present a major issue to our street sweeper both in time and effectiveness. Thank you for your cooperation.

2020 Budget Adoption

There was a public hearing on the 2020 Budget at the October 16th Board Meeting. The Board reviewed the proposed 2020 Budget, which will be adopted according to state law at the next meeting. There were two residents present. This Board meeting will take place on November 20th at 6 p.m. at the DW2 Mail Building. The Budget outlines the estimated revenues and expenditures associated with operating the water, wastewater, road and recreation facilities of the District including our usual road repairs, snow removal, weed control and water and sewer system maintenance projects. Overall, expenditures for 2020 are currently budgeted at \$694,812. Revenues are projected at \$700,409. If you are interested in learning more about operations in the District, please come to the November 20th meeting, when the Board will adopt the Budget.

Dogs on Leash

There have been several instances of dogs being attacked (and injured) by other dogs in the neighborhood. Please keep your dogs on leash when walking, running or biking in the subdivision. 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Winter Preparations

Winter is fast approaching and there are hopes of a big snow year. It is helpful to our snow plow contractors if residents mark their curb lines placing

very tall stakes 10-15 feet apart (no closer). Please do so before the ground freezes. In some areas of the neighborhood, pushing back snow will always be required but if a large storm overwhelms us, pushing back snow may be required in the entire subdivision.

Recreation Survey

The District has limited funds to spend on recreational



amenities. We receive roughly \$3,125 per year in Conservation Trust Fund allocations from the Colorado Division of Local Affairs. This is based on population. Durango West 2 Board wants to get a better idea of current usage of recreational amenities as well as potential use of possible new ones. This will assist the Board in evaluating maintenance and new projects with our limited funds. We are developing a survey which will be emailed to the DW2 group email list hopefully before the end of the year. Keep our Neighborhood Safe – No Parking

Let's keep our neighborhood safe for all residents, pets and especially our children. Please DO NOT park vehicles

on subdivision streets anytime. It is a safety hazard in our neighborhood since we have no sidewalks. It also greatly hinders our maintenance and snowplowing efforts. Parking on District streets is prohibited under Resolution 2004-03.

Respect Our Bears

Bears are looking for food to fatten up for winter. Do NOT leave your trash can out before the morning of pick-up. Residents must either leave their

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trash containers in a garage until the day of pick-up and put the container back inside by the



end of the day or have a bear-proof garbage container. La Plata County has an ordinance that fines residents at least \$200 for not securing trash containers from wildlife. To report a violation, call the Sheriff's office at 385-2900. Check out bearsmartdurango.org for more resources. Keep our neighborhood and our bear neighbors safe by not providing easy food access.

Slow Down for All

Deer are often in the neighborhood, especially this time of year as they



look for extra food on plants and shrubs in your yard. Please SLOW DOWN as you drive through the neighborhood, so you do not risk hitting a deer. They are often out in the mornings and evenings. While the posted speed limit is 25 mph, it is your responsibility to slow down according to situation. Certainly pedestrians, kids and pets, time of day, and road conditions are all reasons to go at a safe speed for the situation. Please be conscientious of all our neighbors and drive safely!

Accessibility of District Property

Reminder to all residents who have District facilities on an easement on your property, including sewer manholes, water curb stops, and fire hydrants: you must maintain adequate access to these facilities. Manholes and water curb stops are not to be covered in landscaping.
