#### Street Gutters – 5 Minute Fall Cleanup

As there has been heavy rainstorms throughout the summer and early fall, we are asking assistance from residents to keep the water flowing properly down our street gutters. There are a lot of leaves, needles, pine cones mixed at times with dirt/mud creating muck which all contribute to clogging the street gutters in various places.

It would be very helpful if every resident could just take 5 minutes to clean up what is in front of their property including any 'muck", dirt, pebbles that may have fallen in the gutters due to snowplowing, melting and runoff. This would ensure proper drainage as well as prevent damage to the adjoining asphalt. Thank you for your cooperation.

#### **Mail Building**

Just a reminder to all residents: Please do not put any free boxes or post anything on the mail building or its posts. #### **Dog Owners**

Please remember that dogs must be either kept on a leash or under voice control while in the greenbelt space or on the road. Residents enjoy walking, running and biking our streets and should feel safe while doing so. There have been several recent reports regarding dogs acting aggressively toward individuals or their dogs. If you spot an aggressive or uncontrolled dog, you can contact Animal Control at Central Dispatch at 385-2900. Dog waste must be picked up by the dog owner. Please be a responsible pet owner and pick up after your dog and respect other people's property. This also applies to the trails and the roads.

#### **Slow Down**

Deer are often in the neighborhood, especially at this time of year as they look for extra food on plants and shrubs in your yard. Please SLOW DOWN as you drive through the neighborhood so you do not risk hitting a deer. They are

often out in the mornings and evenings. The posted speed limit is 25 mph and there is no excuse for speeding down our residential streets any faster than that. Please be conscientious of your neighbors and drive safely!



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#### **Respect Our Bears**



Keep our neighborhood neighbors safe by not providing easy food access.

Bears are out and looking for even more food on their quest to fatten up for winter. Please do not leave birdfeeders or pet food dishes out at night. Do NOT leave your trash can out before the morning of pick-up. Residents must either leave their trash containers in a garage until the day of pick-up and put the container back inside by the end of the day or have a bear-proof garbage container. La Plata County has an ordinance that fines residents at least \$200 for not securing trash containers from wildlife. To report a violation, Animal Protection through Central Dispatch 970-385-2900. Reporting incidents of trash being allowed to be accessed by bears is very important to make our area safe for both bears and people. Check out bearsmartdurango. org for more resources and videos. #### No Parking on Streets – includes trailers, RVs, dumpsters, etc

Parking on District streets is prohibited under Resolution 2004-03. No vehicles, trailers, RV, etc are allowed to be parked on the street. This includes dumpsters. Dumpsters are to be in resident's driveways. It is a safety hazard as we do not have sidewalks in the subdivision. No one wants to be responsible for

someone or someone's pet getting hurt because they parked in the street. It also greatly hinders our maintenance efforts. Please park in your private driveways, and remind your guests and neighbors of our policy.

#### **Preventative Maintenance**

Fall is a great time to do some regular preventative maintenance on your faucets, toilets, water softeners, etc. This can end up saving you lots of water and



money. Be a waterwise resident and save water by doing proper maintenance and conserve water by installing water efficient toilets, shower heads etc

#### Fall Projects - Call Before You Dig

Fall is a great time for outdoor projects and planting. Please remember to call 811 for utility line



markings before you begin digging on a project. Utility lines can be at various depths, so locates are necessary even for small projects. Failure to call in locates can cause outages and possibly result in fines.

#### Water-Saving Tip

Many residents already do this but here is a good watersaving tip: Turn off the water to your toilets when you leave town. Each year, residents leave home for an extended time, not aware that their toilet is running. Even a slow leak could waste up to 50,000 gallons in a month. Please keep a close eye on all your plumbing to ensure water is not being wasted, especially with most residents working so hard to conserve our precious water supply.

#### **Accessibility of District Utilities** and Traffic Signs

Reminder to all residents who have District traffic signs or facilities on an easement on your property, including sewer manholes, water curb stops, and fire hydrants: you must maintain adequate access to these facilities. Manholes, fire



hydrants and water valves are not to be covered in landscaping which includes bushes, tree branches, etc.
