### Street Sweeping Scheduled for week of November 15

The District will be conducting its fall street sweeping sometime the first few weeks of November, depending on weather and status of the needle

drop. Please do not park vehicles or trailers in the street or partially on the street/gutter section. Also, please move anything you may have at the bottom of your driveway to bridge your driveway and the street such as rubber, wood, or other material during these days. These present a major issue to our street sweeper both in time and effectiveness. Thank you for your cooperation.

#### 2023 Budget Hearing

There was a public hearing on the 2023 Budget at the October 19th Board Meeting. No residents attended. The Board reviewed the proposed 2023 Budget, which will be adopted according to state law at the next meeting on November 16th at 5 p.m. The Budget outlines the estimated revenues and expenditures associated with operating the water, wastewater, road and recreation facilities of the District including our usual road repairs, snow removal, weed control and water and sewer system maintenance projects. Overall, expenditures for 2023 are currently budgeted at \$738,309. Revenues are projected at \$704,059. This projected deficit is primarily a result of water fund improvement projects. The deficit will be covered by reserves.

#### **Sewer Service Line Maintenance**

The district has completed its annual main sewer line inspection and cleaning. In the past several years, we have had roots from residential service lines growing into the main and other residents have let us know that they have had issues with back-up or roots in their own service line. We recommend that residents look at getting a contractor to inspect and conduct preventative maintenance on their own sewer service line – as this is cheaper than a sewer

line back up and helps ensure that our main lines remain root and clog free. There are several sewer inspection companies here, but one is Roto Rooter which charges \$248 for preventative maintenance including a line inspection. Their number is 970-247-1040.

### Reminder – Lake Durango "Turns Over" in the Fall - Water Odor

We are aware that some residents have been noticing a different smell or taste in the water. This happens every fall when Lake Durango "turns over". The warm water on top and cold water on bottom need to equalize. This happens when the day temperatures cool down to meet the lower night temperatures. So, the cooler weather this week will likely help hasten the process which means then that the smell and odor will subside. Please note: This is a taste and odor issue, not a health issue. Lake Durango Water Authority regularly tests its water according to state guidelines just as Durango West 2 does.



#### **Winter Preparations**

Winter will arrive soon with snow – hopefully - and it is important to remember that roads may become quite slick in the subdivision in the coming months. Please slow down

and take your time while traveling through the neighborhood on wintery days. Also, please mark your curb lines with tall stakes, so the plow drivers can be as efficient as possible while removing snow from our roads and keeping the streets as wide as possible. It is helpful to our snow plow contractors if residents mark their curb lines placing tall stakes 10-15 feet apart (no closer). Please do so before the ground freezes. In some areas of the neighborhood, pushing back snow will always be required but if a large storm overwhelms us, pushing back snow may be required in the entire subdivision. If there is a fire hydrant on your property, it is your responsibility to keep it cleared of snow.

#### **Slow Down**

Deer are often in the neighborhood, especially at this time of year as they look for extra food on plants and shrubs in your yard. Please SLOW DOWN as you drive through the neigh-

borhood so you do not risk hitting a deer. They are often out in the mornings and evenings. The posted speed limit is 25 mph and there is no excuse for speeding down our residential streets any faster than that. Please be conscientious of your neighbors and drive safely!

#### Street Gutters – 5 Minute Fall Cleanup

Please take 5 minutes to clean the street gutters in front of your home.

There are a lot of leaves, needles, pine cones mixed at times with dirt/mud creating muck which all contribute to clogging the street gutters in various places.



It would be very helpful if every resident could just take 5 minutes to clean up what is in front of their property including any 'muck", dirt, pebbles that may have fallen in the gutters due to snowplowing, melting and runoff. This would ensure proper drainage as well as prevent damage to the adjoining asphalt. **Thank you for your cooperation.**

RESPECT NOT and Keep our NeighGARBAGE borhood Safe

Bears are out and looking

for even more food on their quest to fatten up for winter. Please do not leave birdfeeders or pet food dishes out at night. Do NOT leave your trash can out before the morning of pick-up. Residents must either leave their trash containers in a garage until the day of pick-up and put the container back inside by the end of the day or have a bear-proof garbage container. La Plata County has an ordinance that fines residents at least \$200 for not securing trash containers from wildlife. To report a violation, Animal Protection through Central Dispatch 970-385-2900.

Reporting incidents of trash being allowed to be accessed by bears is very important to make our area safe for both bears and people.

#### Water-Saving Tip

Many residents already do this but here is a good water-saving tip: Each year, residents leave home for an extended time, not aware that their toilet is running. Even a slow leak could waste up to 50,000 gallons in a month. Please keep a close eye on all your plumbing to ensure water is not being wasted, especially with most residents working so hard to conserve our precious water supply.

#### **Accessibility of District Utilities and Traffic Signs**

Reminder to all residents who have District traffic signs or facilities on an easement on your property, including sewer manholes, water curb stops, and fire hydrants: you must maintain adequate access to these facilities. Manholes, fire hydrants and water valves are not to be covered in landscaping which includes bushes, tree branches, etc.
