

Evacuation Checklist

You received a CodeRED notice to evacuate –
what should you do?

GO BAG ESSENTIALS:

- Follow your pre-designated personalized list(s)
 - » You can download from our website
 - Family heirlooms, photos & videos
- Load your go bag(s) in vehicle(s)

PREPARE FAMILY MEMBERS:

- Relay your plans to a contact person

WHAT TO WEAR:

- Wear only cotton or wool clothes, including long pants, long-sleeved shirt or jacket, a hat, and boots
- Carry gloves, water to drink, and goggles
- Keep your cell phone, a flashlight, and portable radio with you at all times
- Tune in to a local radio station and listen for instructions

PREPARE VEHICLE:

- Keep your vehicle's gas tank full
- If you can lift your garage door manually, place vehicle in the garage pointing out with the keys in the ignition and disconnect the electric garage door opener. If not, park in your driveway facing out
- Roll up the car windows
- If you do not drive, make other arrangements for transportation in advance
- Close garage door when you leave

INSIDE THE HOME:

- Close all interior doors and all windows
- Leave a light on in each room
 - Remove lightweight, non-fire-resistant curtains and other combustible materials from around windows
 - Close fire-resistant drapes, shutters, and blinds
- Turn off propane or natural gas valves
- Close fireplace damper
- Close or block off any doggie-doors
- Lock-up firearms or valuables

Evacuation Status Definition

- Green means GO now: Mandatory evacuation
- Yellow means SET: Pack your things, be prepared for evacuation
- Red means READY: Be ready for possible evacuation
- Grey means PLANNING: Evacuation areas identified for planning purposes only - No status assigned
