April is National Safe Digging Month



April is National Safe Digging Month, reminding all Colorado residents to always

call 811 at least three business days before any digging project. When calling 811, homeowners and contractors are connected to Colorado 811 which notifies the appropriate utility companies of their intent to dig. Professional locators are then sent to the requested digging site to mark the approximate locations of underground lines with flags, paint or both. Every six minutes an underground utility line is damaged because someone decided to dig without first calling 811. Striking a single line can cause injury, repair costs, fines and inconvenient outages. Every digging project, no matter how small, warrants a call to 811. Slow Down

While the roads are currently clear, there are still

sizeable snowbanks that should still make everyone drive slower and cautiously. People and pets are out enjoying the spring weather so SLOW DOWN for everyone's safety.

Drought Update (from the Colorado Water Availability Task Force)

February and March-to-date have both seen impressive snow accumulation statewide, especially in the southern half of the state where snowpack is currently above 150 percent of normal for all basins. This persistent moisture and near normal temperatures resulted in significant drought improvements across the region. As of March 19th, exceptional drought and extreme drought have been entirely removed from Colorado. Most of the western slope has seen three and even four class improvements in drought conditions since the start of the water year. El Niño conditions are now present; and will likely continue through spring (80 percent chance) and even summer (60 percent chance).

DW2 BOARD NOTE: While this is great news, the Board advises residents that we do live in the desert Southwest and to practice conservation measures always as water is a precious resource. Please remember this when making decisions regarding landscaping or plants and choose xeric-landscaping options when practical. Here is one resource: http://coloradowaterwise.org/XeriscapeColorado.

DW2 Water Sources

Some of our water comes from our wells within DW2, and some of our water comes from Lake Du-

rango Water Authority (LDWA). Our well water supply is not enough to supply all our needs, and well production varies depending on the level of the aquifers. In times of drought, and sometimes even the year following, that production will likely be more limited. We make up the difference with purchases from LDWA. LDWA purchases water from Lake Nighthorse then sells that water to DW2, among other districts and retail customers. While this means that DW2 has a more consistent water supply through LDWA, it comes at a cost and is not an unlimited supply. LDWA contracts with Lake Nighthorse to purchase a set number of acre feet each year in addition to its other water rights. DW2 pays a flat rate to access LDWA water. Our acquisition and monthly bulk service fees are \$8,519 every month. Water usage is in addition to that is on a tiered structure depending on total gallons purchased per month. Despite our Stage 1 water restrictions last summer due to the exceptional drought, we still had very high water use during the summer months, resulting in much higher water costs for the district.

Meter Upgrades

We are hoping to finish up our meter upgrade project in the next several months. This is not optional. The meters and installation are free. Our water operator needs access to your crawl space to install the new meter so someone does need to be at home for just an hour appointment. This upgrade benefits both individual residents and the District. Our water operator has already been able to detect small to larger size leaks with the new system. Due to the wet, muddy conditions under many people's crawl space, we are taking April off and scheduling residents for May.

Bears and Springtime



Warm weather returning brings the return of our neighbors – bears. Leave your trash containers inside until the morning of trash pick-up day. It's a good

idea to take your bird feeders in at night as well. La Plata County has an ordinance that fines residents at least \$200 for not securing trash containers from wildlife. You can report trash can raids by bears to County Dispatch at 385-2900.

Bear Reports: If you see a bear passing by, you can report it to Colorado Parks and Wildlife at 247-0855 or Bear Smart Durango at 749-4262; or use an online form at: bearsmartdurango.org/report-a-bear-sighting/. Reporting bear sightings can help these groups prevent and understand conflicts between bears and humans.
